

# Creative Silhouette Series: Glass Etching



Have you ever wanted to learn the art of glass etching but aren't sure where to start? Are you etching but not getting the finish you'd like? We'll explore how to use the Silhouette Cutting System to create vinyl masks and stencils for etching. Then we'll use etchall's family of products to create beautifully etched glass gifts, keepsakes, and heirlooms.

## Supply List

- Etchall Etching Crème (brown) available at [etchall.com](http://etchall.com)
- Dip N' Etch from [etchall.com](http://etchall.com) (optional)
- Plastic container (disposable) larger than the item you plan to dip n etch
- Vinyl to fit Silhouette
- Silhouette Cameo, Portrait, SD or other Silhouette cutting system with software installed on a computer
- Contact paper
- Etchall squeegee (or old plastic gift card)
- Surgical or vinyl gloves
- Sink and running water
- Kitchen timer
- Glass to etch – beer mugs, vases, or other glassware available at Dollar Tree Stores is recommended

## Syllabus

- Create an image in the Silhouette software to cut from vinyl to use as a mask or stencil with the etching crème
- How to apply vinyl to the glass item to be etched
- How to safely and accurately apply etchall crème to glass; plus tips and tricks
- How to use Dip N Etch
